can be difficult.



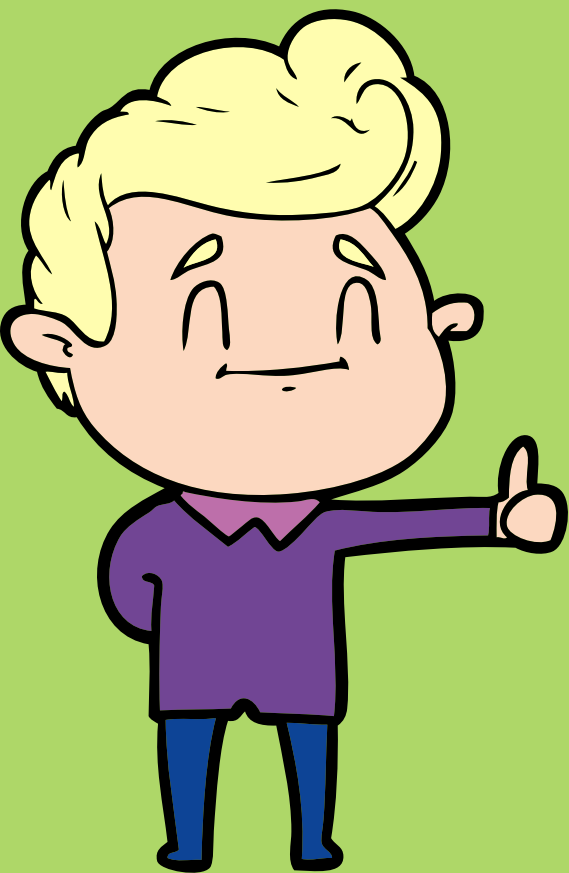
I will try my best to be understanding of others who may have a harder time communicating online or may be new to Discord. This will help everyone have fun!
