Autism Connections: a Pathlight program

DESE/DDS Program Interest Forms are due 12/31/2019!

The DESE/DDS Program is designed to provide in-home and community based therapeutic supports to students ages 6 to 22, who demonstrate a need for services to prevent a more restrictive out of home residential placement. This Program also offers an increased level of support services to families whose student returns from a residential school placement and requires assistance to remain at home.

Completion of the DESE/DDS Interest Form only serves to show a family's interest in the Program, and does not guarantee participation in the DESE/DDS Program which will be determined through an Assessment and Prioritization Process.


