Thank you for making 2018 another amazing year for Autism Connections! It was a year filled with familiar faces along with many new people. Our dedicated teams



have done an incredible job furthering our outreach, strengthening our programs and honoring our mission. Autism Connections' mission is to help individuals, families, schools, professionals, agencies and communities understand autism, promote the well-being of individuals with autism, and foster their inclusion in the community. We work to help Individuals and families build on their

strengths, create a positive vision for the future, and help children with autism learn, grow, and be welcomed, fully included members of their communities.

Here are some highlights of our accomplishments in 2018:

- ♦ 47,400 newsletters sent to individuals, families, and professionals
- ♦ 3,216 connections made through information phone calls and walk-ins
- 522 individuals and families who attended one or more of our events
- 32 community outreach events to help connect with new individuals and families
- ◆ 21 family events, including sensory-friendly holiday parties, picnics, movie nights, and school vacation events
- ♦ 11 workshops to support individuals, families and professionals
- ♦ 5 parent and peer groups that meet weekly or monthly
- ♦ 73 adults currently in our newly established Supports Program
- ♦ 28th Annual Autism Connections Conference held

It's been an honor and a pleasure working with all of you this past year and 2019 is going to be even better! We are starting the year with a newly formed Adult Support Program led by Program Manager Danielle Scibelli. She and her team are dedicated to providing high quality, flexible, individualized supports to adults with autism in western Massachusetts. Their span of expertise and experience supports a multi-tiered approach that focuses on a person's wants, needs and goals. It has certainly solidified quickly in the first few months of its development.

As you may know we have many offices throughout western Massachusetts. In the early months of 2019 our office located on North Street in Pittsfield is moving to a bigger space with better parking. Our new office will be in the Eagle Building at 75 Church Street, Pittsfield. We can still be found at our North Street office until at least March. The Autism Collaborative of Berkshire County, January ACBC Meeting



The Autism Collaborative of Berkshire County (ACBC) resumed monthly meetings in January. The topic of January's meeting, Relationships, Sexuality, and Autism, focused on two different ways to approach teaching the subject to people with Autism. Rebecca Cachat of Berkshire County ARC presented material from the Elevatus curriculum. She gave us some insight on the lesson plans and how she is teaching them to her current classes.

Our second presenter, Regina Mason, talked about her experience teaching a class for adults who come with lots of knowledge and education. Regina is co-teaching this class with Kelly Summers, an Autism Specialist at Autism Connections. Kelly works with some of the participants outside of class time, helping them to apply classroom strategies in the community.

During her presentation, Regina talked about how the curriculum they are creating is based solely on the needs that emerge from conversations in the group. The curriculum is a mesh of role playing, teaching concrete skills, and working to "fill the holes" in learning. Her goal is to make these classes as applicable to real life as possible. The title of the class, *Navigating Social Nuances*, does just that, prepare the participants with a real life understanding of relationship building, social communication, and safely engaging in intimate relationships.


