## **Social Skills Gym Class**

Every Tuesday a group of 8-10 rambunctious boys get together with their instructor, Brian Putnam at the Patterson Fieldhouse at Berkshire Community College. They are working on social skills that are embedded within a workout routine and physical activity.

Each class the kids work on being a gracious loser and winner, giving praise to their teammates, taking turns, waiting for a turn, and following directions. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the Social Skills Gym Class and the start wasn't so smooth. In the first year of this class we used a classroom model. The learned very quickly that having a group of boys sit and attend after being in school all day was a fruitless effort. With some tweaking and reworking of our goal, teaching social skills, Social Skills Gym Class was born!

The gym class has been a successful way to integrate social skills within fun, exercise, and practice of skills all at the same time. We are lucky to be working with Brian Putnam. He is a seasoned personal fitness trainer and runs fitness groups at Retro Fitness in Pittsfield.

## Preparing for a medical appointment

Doctor's appointments can be overwhelming for someone with autism. The change in routine, extended waiting periods, unfamiliar social scenarios and infringement on personal space can make a perfect recipe for a stressful day. Planning ahead and good communication with your doctor's office can help make this a more positive experience.

Here's a few tips to help make your child's medical appointments a success:

Depending on your loved one's age and the best method that helps them process, consider reading them a picture book or watching a short video in which a favorite character goes to the doctor. Engage in a conversation with your child about what is occurring in the story, and draw comparisons as to what he/she will experience at the doctor's office.

Make a Social Story explaining what will happen when at the doctor's. Ask your doctor's office if they can provide photos of their office to include. Review this with your child frequently in the days prior the appointment so they know what to expect.

Create a visual schedule that outlines the steps of a doctor's visit (checking in at the front desk, sitting in the waiting room, getting on the scale, etc). Cross off or remove each task once it's accomplished.

Consult with your child's support team (teacher, inhome therapeutic staff, etc) prior to the appointment to collaborate on the best way to help your child plan for the visit in advance.

Think about your child's preferences and challenges – does he/she find fluorescent lighting, touch, or certain sounds disruptive? Can you practice some of the tasks at home first? This could include getting on a scale, using a stethoscope or blood pressure (toy versions of some medical equipment are available for purchase).

Think about the time of day that would work best for your child. Would a morning or evening appointment be less disruptive to their schedule? Don't be afraid to ask



your doctor's office when they are least likely to have a longer wait time.

Call your doctor's office in advance to plan your child's visit with them. Explain your child's environmental sensitivities, any behavior challenges, and preferred communication style. Explain the approach your child responds to best. Is it a soft voice or a firm one? Should doctors and nurses limit themselves to one-step directions? How much time does your child need to process a statement? Should there be fewer people in the room?

The Autism Collaborative at Cooley Dickinson Hospital has created an Autism Acute Care Questionnaire to help alert Emergency Medical personnel to an person with autism's needs. This can also be useful as a reference point when discussing your child's needs with any medical professional. To receive a copy, email <u>Katie.drumm@pathlightgroup.org</u>

Prepare a list of questions or concerns you want to discuss at the appointment, whether or not you are able to talk to the nurse in advance. It's hard to remember everything while supporting your child as well.

Prepare a bag of fun, distracting activities and "comfort" items to bring to the appointment (for example, video games, DVD movie players, dolls, music, noise blocking headphones, or sensory stimulatory items). Be sure to bring any assistive communication methds your child may use, such as an iPad or PECs board.
