Autism Connections: a Pathlight program

Last call for the Flutie Grant Application

Don't forget to apply for a Doug Flutie Foundation for Autism grant, generously awarded again to Autism Connections to support local families.



The focus of this grant is to enhance the quality of life for people with autism. Autism Connections has been awarded

\$10,000 to provide allocations to families of children with autism, which may be used for a wide variety of purposes related to best supporting an individual.

Families that meet the criteria will be eligible to receive up to \$300.00 to purchase items or fund activities that empower, enhance and provide opportunities for their child with autism. This grant cannot fund the purchase of iPads.

Those applying for the grant must meet the following criteria:

- Have a low to moderate household income
- Must be a family of a child or adult child with a diagnosis on the autism spectrum residing at home
- Must be living in Hampshire, Franklin, Hampden Counties, or the Worcester County towns of Royalston, Athol, Petersham, and Phillipston
- Must NOT be receiving services through the MA Autism Waiver

Program

- Must NOT be receiving services through the DDS DESE Program
- Must NOT be receiving Adult DDS Services
- Must NOT be receiving services through the DDS IFFS Program
- Must be willing to turn in receipts from funds used and submit a thank you note to the Doug Flutie, Jr.
 Foundation for Autism


